Fabric Ornaments

Presented by Chris Summers and Damaris Lane



FOLDED FABRIC STAR TUTORIAL


Supplies needed: fabric, iron, spray starch, scissors, small clips, glue, heavy needle, floss or thin ribbon.




Cut four 4" x 16" rectangles of fabric using any combination of colors. Press rectangles with a heavy spray of starch.




Press in half lengthwise, then open and press edges to the center line. Fold and press in half again to make strips.



Fold strips at the center and weave. Green inside the folded blue strip, blue inside red, red inside yellow, yellow inside green.




Tighten up the woven strips nice and snug by sliding them to the center.




Flip the whole piece over and fold the top layer of the left strip over the center. Then fold the top layer of the top strip down.




Continue folding around the square. Secure the fourth fold by tucking it under the first strip. Then pull all the ends nice and snug.



Fold any top right strip to the outside making a right angle. Crease folds with your finger as you work.




Flip the whole piece over and fold the end straight down.



Snip the end off slightly above the edge of the strip below so it will be hidden when tucked.





Fold and **tuck** the cut end under the strip below. A clip keeps the point neat. Repeat steps 7-10 with the next point, starting with the fold to the outside.



Continue around all eight points. **Fold, flip, fold, snip, fold, tuck**. Put a dot of glue inside the layers of each point and inside the tucks for extra hold.



Thread a heavy needle with about 10" of floss. Pull the floss between two points and tie a loop. Press the finished star. Beautiful!
