Old Business:

Chris Summers presented a nametag to Barb Linares.

Barb provided information about how the Bingo block game will work; this will be the April program. Bingo blocks must be completed by that meeting. Bingo Kits are available for purchase (\$10.00). Due to the number of kits available, members may only purchase one Bingo kit. Half of the purchase price will go to the Guild; the other half will be awarded to the winner of the Bingo game that night. Other prizes will also be awarded that evening. Barb Linares (Crafty Threads) is providing the fabric for the Bingo blocks and other prizes for the Bingo block game at the April meeting. 
