Hedy shared a blanket design that is lovely and simple for us to consider if interested in making quilts for this service project. Handouts were available with the directions for making the quilt.

Damaris reminded the members about the upcoming Spring Retreat and asked those attending to please take some pictures to be shared in the newsletter.

Brenda Myrick won the 4 corners game, Barbara Jordan won the Irish Chain game, Connie Syford won the center 9-Patch game, and there were 5 winners for the final all spaces covered: Barbara Jordan, Joy Bass, Linda Bacon, Joyce Herrin, and Dianne Dees.
