Moultrie Arts Center is having their 2024 Quilt Exhibition June 20-July 31. Damaris encouraged all members to attend the show and see the beautiful quilts on display. Some of our Guild quilters have quilts on display. Opening reception is June 20, 2024 at 5:30 pm. Kathleen Haehnel will provide a demonstration at the July meeting. Tonight's program is a trunk show provided by Linda Bacon. An array of beautiful quilts was shared and enjoyed by all. The class/workshop/seminar conducted by Chris Summers was very successful. All in attendance learned a very good method was constructing a "border magic" quilt. A very tasty lunch was also provided. A total of \$715.00 was raised for the guild. Damaris expressed hope that some had brought their quilts to share this evening.

Show and Tell:

Challenge quilts were on display this evening as well. Damaris has spoken with someone who will judge the Challenge quilt entries and hopefully will have the results by the July meeting.


